Featured on Sunday at Bancroft is Bernulf, a well known acoustic duo from Barnoldswick. Heather, (guitar and vocals) and Elaine (mandola, bodhran and ukulele) will entertain visitors to the mill during pauses in the engine run. They enjoy performing a mixture of traditional, contemporary and self-penned songs largely influenced by their Lancashire/Yorkshire heritage and, on Sunday, material specially suited to this not-to-be-missed occasion.

Just completed is a new recording of their award-winning song "James & Mary Jane" (about the Bancroft engine) which will be available as a CD single from the Bancroft Mill shop or from Bernulf. As a bonus, the CD also contains nearly 10 minutes of the HD sounds of the mill engine as recorded by the Lancashire Sound Archives.

There will be weaving demonstrations whilst many artefacts, the Cornish boiler under steam and model engines, are all on view. The Bradley engine rebuild is ongoing. There will be ample free car parking, the souvenir shop with Bancroft Mill memorabilia, DVDs, clocks and tea towels woven on site. The cafeteria will be open from 1.15pm or sooner.

We are happy to welcome a good number of new members who have joined over the last month or so. We hope to see you all, often! Meanwhile Bancroft is taking itself down into the Square in Barlick on Saturday 3rd September to meet the townsfolk; we shall have a stand in the marquee, for the day, with items from our shop on sale and to meet friends.
